

Your Summer Project List

Every summer there are things around the house that folks work on and projects they check off their to-do list. If you are making your list as summer approaches, I have something to add. Invite someone to church. Most churches shut down their programs and even eliminate worship opportunities during the summer. At Mt. Pleasant, we actually gear up to offer additional ministries during the summer months. So... take out your list and invite someone to church.

Let's face it. When we invite people to church, the idea of it can be nerve-wracking.

There's a lot of inner dialogue that happens. How do I bring it up in conversation? What if I come across as judgmental? What if I get rejected? The tendency is to ask a lot of "what if" questions that focus on the negative side. But what if you reminded yourself of the potential, instead?

- What if God has been preparing their heart and has been waiting for me to invite them?
- What if they say yes?
- What if they're hurting and find healing at church?
- What if they give their life to Christ, and future generations are changed because of it?



Keep those in mind, and use the tips below to overcome any fears you might have!

How do you bring it up in conversation?

Approach #1 – When you're not sure whether they attend a church.

Lead with this simple question.

I was wondering, do you go to church anywhere?

If they answer yes, then the follow-up conversation is easy.

That's great! So happy to hear you have a church home. What church do you attend?

This approach works because it celebrates the church they're connected to and shows them you're not trying to recruit them to your church.

If they answer no, you can follow up with an invite.

Well, if you're ever looking for a great place to go, I go to Mt. Pleasant and would love to see you there! This language is simple, casual, and friendly in tone. It doesn't assume they're looking for a church and leaves the decision up to them.

If they ask a question or share a bit of their faith journey, then it's a good sign they're open to hearing more. Always offer to meet them out front so you can escort them into worship. As a bonus, invite them to a small group or to join you for lunch following worship.

Take the opportunity to share more about your church: why you love it, how God's used it in your life, give them an invite card, etc.

Approach #2 – When you know someone doesn't attend a church.

Try leading with this question:

I'm curious—did you ever go to church when you were growing up?

The key with this question is how you follow up. This question is an easy way to start a conversation, but the real value is learning more about a person's background with church, faith, and Christianity. There could be many reasons why someone doesn't currently attend a church. They could've had a bad experience growing up. Been hurt by people. Maybe they've always wanted to but never made it a priority. Whatever the reason, you're trying to understand why. So don't be afraid to ask follow-up questions.

- Have you ever thought about attending a church (again)?
- If you don't mind me asking, how come you don't see yourself going to church?
- If it's not too personal a question, what was the bad experience you had?

The answers to these questions will help you tailor a more personal invite at the right time. Use what you learn, and ask God for wisdom on how best to invite them to church. That could be during this conversation or another time.

Is there something about your church they'd like? Is there a specific message series you can share that speaks to a situation they're going through?

Remember, you don't have to invite people to church the very first time you talk to them. That can be something you work toward.

Who is waiting on you to invite them to be a part of a loving church family?

Danny has also been making excellent progress with the church security and EMS response teams. He is working to get volunteers trained and a structured team on site each Sunday for the safety and security of our congregation.

We have merged the 11:00 am services and will be conducting a single service in the sanctuary, at least through the summer. If you haven't visited the 11:00 service in the sanctuary, please consider attending to participate in our traditional worship service.

Lastly, we have sent out a flyer to see if our leadership and small group leaders are interested in receiving some training in Biblical Counseling. The Association of Certified Biblical Counselors offers training to assist Christians in becoming more comfortable offering Biblical counsel to those who are struggling. We are gauging interest in hopes we can get a reduced group rate. It is a self-paced course of on-line videos with an accompanying notebook over 15 weeks. As always, thanks to our staff for all the hard work on the upcoming summer programs. Jennifer, Donny, Greg and Felecia are all working with our volunteers to bring the Youth and Kids Summer programs to you.

That's why learning about different ways to connect with God and getting to know Him better is so important. Because like any relationship, with the right habits in place, connection is more likely to happen. And the more we connect with God, the deeper our faith goes.

DAILY CUES



Morning Time

Commit to creating a habit of encouraging your teenager a certain number of days this week. Before your teenager heads out for the day, try to work in a unique way of encouraging them. Tell them something you admire about their personality. Even compliment their outfit. Just make it genuine and heartfelt!



Meal Time

A consistent meal time with teenagers can be a rare thing. But studies show this time, happening on a regular basis, matters. So set a goal this coming month, for how many meals your family can eat together- whether around a table or just in the same room. Make it less about the food and more about intentionally connecting with your teens. Leave phones in another room, turn off the TV, and come with some "would you rather" questions to spur on conversation.



Their Time

In the next week, ask your teenager to pick an activity for just the two of you. Maybe it's play a video game, watch a favorite show of theirs, or grab some chips and salsa at their favorite Mexican restaurant. Whatever it is they want to do, make sure you are all in. No complaints. No checking your phone. No looking at your watch. See if this time shared together could end up becoming a habit for you and your teenager!



Bed Time

Before your teen heads to bed, ask them if there is anything you could be praying about for them. You can pray together if they share something or, if that makes you uncomfortable, tell them you will be setting an alarm on your phone to get you in the habit of praying for this concern on a regular basis. Then be sure to do it! Don't forget to follow up with them later.
