

things new & old christians need to know

Maybe you came to church to get your friend or co-worker to stop hounding you.Maybe you came as a gift to your parents or a last ditch effort to help surround your teen with positive role models.

One way or another, you showed up to church and something in you changed. For the first time, you understood who Jesus is, what He did for you, and the life He wants for you. And when presented the truth of the Gospel...you were in.

When you said yes to a relationship with Jesus, you said yes to eternity in heaven and a new life here on earth. It was all so exciting on Sunday, but then you wake up on Monday, and you face the question: **What happens now?**

Three things every "new Christian" needs to know, and "old Christians" need to remember.

1. YOU ARE DIFFERENT NOW.

2 Corinthians 5:17 says, "Therefore if anyone is in Christ the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!"

When we ask Jesus into our lives, we are made new. You are not the person you used to be.

The addict? That's the old you. In Jesus, you can overcome.

The cheater? Not who you are anymore. In Jesus, your relationship can be restored.

The liar? Dead. In Jesus, you have the ability to understand God's truth and share it with others.

As we follow Jesus, our actions and desires begin to change. Jesus' death paid the penalty for your past sin as well as all the sin you'll commit today and in the future. He's that powerful! And that same power is now in you. When you become a Christian, you receive the Holy Spirit. He is our guide and gives us the ability to overcome sin.

You may not feel instantly stripped of all of your imperfections and insecurities. Part of learning to follow Jesus step by step is learning to hear from Jesus and do what He says.

As we follow Jesus, our actions and desires begin to change. Instead of wanting the things our old selves would want and doing the things our old selves would do, we find ourselves wanting what Jesus wants and doing what Jesus would do.

He is our guide and gives us the ability to overcome sin.

2. YOU DON'T HAVE TO FIGURE IT ALL OUT ON YOUR OWN.

So many of us have believed the lie that seeking others' help and guidance is a sign of weakness. This is pride. We can only grow so much on our own.

Hebrews 10: 24-25 tells us the opposite: "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up on meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another — and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

Jesus had close friends and followers, called disciples. He spent every day with these guys, teaching them and sharing meals with them. His relationship with the disciples is the perfect example of what community looks like. If we really want to follow Jesus we must begin to build authentic relationships with other Christians.

3. KEEP COMING BACK TO CHURCH.

Romans 10:17 says, "faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ."

The best way to know Jesus better is to learn more about who He is. Just as a teacher uses their teacher's manual to instruct students, a pastor uses the Bible to teach Jesus' followers about Him. As we grow in our understanding of who Jesus is and apply what we're learning in everyday life, things start to change. We'll find we have peace we didn't know was possible and a more purposeful life than we ever dreamed.

Salvation is a starting point, not a destination. Just like relationships with other people grow over time, your relationship with Jesus grows over time as we follow Him. You don't have to figure out how to be Christian all at once or all on your own. Keep coming to church, connect with other Christians, and trust that the Jesus who saved you will continue to guide you over time.

Greetings Mt. Pleasant Church from your Elder team. Sticking with last month's theme, summertime is all about the young people of MTP. However, I believe our primary goal should be to maintain our focus on Jesus and not just on the fun things. All throughout scripture, we are reminded the importance of leading children to Christ. In Matthew, Jesus himself tells us, "Let the children come to me. Don't stop them! For the Kingdom of Heaven belongs to those who are like these children." (Matthew 19:14) In Deuteronomy, Moses reminds us to "Teach them to your children. Talk about them when you are at home and when you are on the road, when you are going to bed and when you are getting up." (Deuteronomy 11:19) when he's speaking to the Israelites about the blessings of being obedient to God's word. And in the book of Proverbs, it tells us that "The godly walk with integrity; blessed are their children who follow them." (Proverbs 20:7) In fact, the entire book of Proverbs can be viewed as an instruction manual for young people to avoid stumbling blocks in their faith walk. These scriptures, along with countless others in the Bible should serve as a reminder of our obligation as both parents and believers to teach our children about Jesus. As I've heard it said before, if we aren't teaching our children, someone else is! How tremendous of an opportunity and a blessing it is to be part of a church body that makes this a priority when oftentimes it's someone else's child that we're teaching. Psalms 78:5-7 tells us that instructing our children is a generational matter and that our actions and teachings will have an impact on our children's children. My prayer is that we don't become shortsighted and only live in the moment. Instead, allow us have a vision for generations to come and that the way we interact with our youth today will truly make a difference in their future so that they may pass it on for others to learn from them. Having a fun filled summer is what we all strive for but as a church, if we're leaving Jesus out of it then we have failed at being the disciples we are called to be.

Mission Committee

We are still looking for volunteers to help with the CCM Meals

The Mission Committee has committed to feed homeless folks at Grace Lutheran Church on Unity Street in Thomasville on the 2nd Thursday of each month. Currently, they are feeding 80 people beginning at 6pm until 7pm.

If you would like to help - you can sign up in the church lobby or reach out to a member of the Mission Committee. More directions will be provided to those who volunteer to help us meet our commitment.

The missionaries we are highlighting this month are serving in a country where they can be arrested or in danger for sharing their faith. I'm not able to share specific names, location or the people they serve. I'll be using initials and vague references to where they are.

L and R are a husband and wife team who live in central Asia with a Turkish people group, serving through counseling, teaching English and business. R's primary responsibilities are homeschooling their two girls, and she has a handcraft business that employs a dozen of the local ladies. Most of them are unbelievers, and it provides R with opportunities to share God's word and talk with them on a regular basis.

L is currently involved in a small local church helping to disciple through Bible teaching at the church meeting. He is also the team leader for their small group. Currently they serve with one other family. He is also completing a certification in Biblical counseling from ACBC because there are limited resources like that for the people group they serve.

In R's handcraft workspace, they just finished the life of Solomon and the book of Ecclesiastes during tea breaks. They learned that apart from fearing God and enjoying what He gives, life is meaningless when we chase after things that will later disappear. Nothing but knowing God will fill us.

L has felt the burdens of daily ministry, but God has had him realize all the good things he is able to do day to day. Recently he had the privilege to counsel a man online, meet with a woman to work on reconciliation between her and her in-laws, disciple one of their interns, study the word with a group of guys, share the good news of Jesus with those who had never been told, and preach 3 times in 3 different languages.

Prayer requests include more families joining their team and more people to help teach English at the village school. Also pray for their safety as they do God's work!
