PROVIDING TIME FOR FUN INTERACTION 15 MINUTES						

MADE TO PLAY

an activity that encourages learning through following guidelines and working as a group



Before kids arrive, pray that today your kids would be honest about how they spend their time and look for how God may be stirring in them to use their time to help others around them.

1. JUST FOR FUN

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container

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- Welcome kids as they arrive.
- Invite anyone who has brought an offering to place it in the offering container.
- Choose two kids who don't mind being the center of attention to go first.
- Explain that they are going to work together to tell a story.
- Direct them to sit, facing each other, in front of the group.
 - They will tell a story by alternating single words to formulate sentences. For example:
 - Kid 1: Once
 - Kid 2: Upon
 - Kid 1: A
 - Kid 2: Time
 - They will continue to go back and forth until they have completed a short story.
- After they finish their story, invite two more kids to take a turn.
- Play again as time allows.

an activity that increases the oxygen in the brain and taps into the energy in the body

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2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: Masking tape

WHAT YOU DO:

• Use the tape to create a "Start" and "Finish" line on opposite ends of your group space.

• Tell kids to form pairs. (Join one of the kids if there is an uneven number.)

- Line everyone up with their partners along the "Start" line.
- Explain that kids will be racing with their partner to get to the "Finish" line. Direct one kid from each pair to walk on their hands while their partner
- walks behind them, holding their ankles. (i.e.: Wheelbarrow Race)
 Say, "Go!" when pairs are ready to begin the race. The first pair to the "Finish" line wins!
 - NOTE: For smaller spaces, you can direct kids to travel to the "Finish" line, turn around, and then head back to the "Start" line to complete the race.
- Play again but switch roles so the kid who was walking on their hands will now hold their partner's ankles.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"What amazing teamwork! In this game, you really had to help each other out! [Transition] In Large Group today, we'll hear about how Jesus made time to help someone and how it changed that person's life forever."

Lead your group to the Large Group area.

MADE TO IMAGINE

an activity that promotes empathy and facilitates biblical application through role-play and reenactment

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1. TAKE A SNAPSHOT

[LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Pick a Plot" Activity Page, miscellaneous props, glow sticks

25 MINUTES

WHAT YOU DO:

- Create groups of two to four kids each.
- Give each group a card from the "Pick a Plot" Activity Page.
- Select a few of the miscellaneous props to give each group.
- Explain that each group will read their card then work together to create a short skit that shows how they would make time to help someone else in that scenario.
 - They can use the props they were given however they would like in their skit. Encourage them to be creative!
- After some practice time, give each group a turn to perform their skit in front of everyone.
- Encourage those watching to clap after each performance.
- Invite the group to form a circle after each team has finished their skit.
- Give each kid a glowstick. Tell them not to bend them yet.
- Ask:
 - Why is it sometimes difficult to make time to help others?
 - Have you ever had to give up something to help someone else?
- Explain that sometimes making time to help others is a sacrifice. Jesus was a busy man on a mission, but He didn't let that stop Him from taking the detour to help Bartimaeus. Jesus knew it was worth it to show compassion.
- Tell kids to bend their glow sticks. Explain that their glow sticks would not illuminate if they didn't bend them first. Explain we have to first be willing to bend—or give something up. When we are willing to set ourselves aside and make time for others, we shine Jesus' light to those around us!

[Make it Personal] Share about a time when you had to give something up to make time to help someone else. Discuss how it changed that person. Share how it impacted you.

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2. BIBLE STORY EXTENSION

[TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Flashlight Trivia" Activity Page, black posterboard, white chalk, flashlights

- Divide the group into two teams.
- Direct teams to gather on opposite sides of the group space and come up with a team name.
- Place a piece of black posterboard between the teams.
- Use chalk to draw a line through the center of the posterboard, dividing it in half.
- Write a team name on each half of the posterboard.
- Choose one kid from each team to go first and invite them to stand at the edge of the black posterboard, facing each other.
- Hand each volunteer a flashlight.
- Explain that you are going to ask a trivia question from today's Bible story using the "Flashlight Trivia" Activity Page.
 - If they know the answer, they shine their flashlight onto the black posterboard.
 - Whoever flashes their light first gets to answer the question.
- If they answer the question correctly, use the chalk to draw two tally marks on their side of the posterboard.
- If they answer the question incorrectly, the other contestant will get a chance to answer. If correct, draw just one tally mark on their side of the posterboard.
- If neither contestant answers the question correctly, share the correct answer with everyone. No one gets a point.
- Repeat with a different kid from each team until all trivia questions from the "Flashlight Trivia" Activity Page have been asked.
- Celebrate the team with the most points as the winning team.
 - Ask:
 - How did being blind impact Bartimaeus? (Kids will likely emphasize he couldn't see. Lead them to discover he was also likely cast out of society, left to beg on the streets, and not able to be in community with others. That must have been extremely lonely.)
 - Other than the ability to see, what did Bartimaeus gain when Jesus healed him? (Community with people and an even stronger faith in Jesus.)
 - Did it show weakness or strength when Bartimaeus called out for help from Jesus? (Strength because sometimes it takes courage to ask for help! Sometimes, we worry about what people might think about us if we need help. Bartimaeus' belief in Jesus' ability to help him shows us how strong his faith was.)
 - Remind kids that you never know how showing compassion might affect someone else. It's so important that we make time to help others!

3. DISCUSSION QUESTIONS [TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: No supplies needed

WHAT YOU DO:

Ask:

- When has someone made time for you?
- How does it make you feel when someone makes time for you?
- Do you like receiving help from someone else? Why or why not?
- Why is time so valuable?
- What are some ways you can make time to help others?

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4. VERSES TO TAKE WITH YOU

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY] WHAT YOU NEED: "Seek and Find" Activity Page, blindfold, envelope, Bibles

25 MINUTES

- Direct the kids to gather and form a wide circle.
- Choose a volunteer to stand up. Secure a blindfold over their eyes.
- Explain that you are going to place an envelope somewhere in your group space for them to find by slowly walking around and listening for guidance from the rest of the group.
- Explain the rest of the group will give clue words, like *Hot*, *Cold*, *Warm*, or *Cool* to let the blindfolded kid know whether they are getting closer or farther away from the envelope.
- Set out the envelope and invite the group to start calling out clue words until the blindfolded kid finds it.
- Once they do, help take off their blindfold. Direct them to take one card out of the envelope and hold on to it.
- Repeat with different kids until all the cards have been removed from the envelope.
 - If preferred, you can give each kid a turn even after all the cards have been removed.
- Give each kid who has a card a Bible and ask them to look up the verse reference written on it.
- Allow kids to help each other with finding the verses if needed.
- Give each kid a turn to read their verse out loud for the entire group.
- After each verse, ask:
 - What stands out to you about this verse?
 - What does it have to do with helping others?

an activity that creates space for personal understanding and application

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5. MAKE IT PERSONAL WITH PRAYER [PRAY TO GOD | PRAYER ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Prayer Plan" Activity Page, pens or pencils

- Direct kids to spread out in your group space.
- Explain that when we pay more attention to others, we are more likely to notice what they need.
 - We may not be able to plan for those needs, but we can practice making ourselves aware and available.
 - One way we can help others is by spending time praying for them.
- Give each kid a copy of the "Prayer Plan" Activity Page and a pen or pencil.
- Direct kids to write their names at the top of their Activity Page.
- Give kids time to think of how they can make a plan to pray throughout the week.
 - They can take time to write in the space provided on their "Prayer Plan" Activity Page about how they plan to pray and who they plan to pray for.
- Offer suggestions if kids need prompting for ideas on when to pray, where to pray, etc.
- Ask for a volunteer to pray for the group before you dismiss.
