Don't Settle For Comfort, Safety & No Risk

What's the biggest risk you've ever taken? Maybe your last big risk was a decade ago.

Maybe you've never taken a big risk in Jesus' name.

I want you to think about what being bold and taking bold steps may look like.

Be bold! That statement looks attractive on paper and feels good to say out loud. It reminds us of every movie where the underdog gets the courage to become the hero.

Like many parts of life, bold moves are easier to talk about and dream about than to do. Because unlike the character on the big screen, our bold moves have real-life consequences.



Most of our fears come from not knowing what will happen. We might have to go through a dark valley to get to quiet waters and green pastures (Psalm 23:1-4).

So instead, we play it safe. We do what is expected. We take the path of least resistance because the idea of making bold moves overwhelms us.

The problem is that the life of faith is not always comfortable. Jesus saves us and invites us into a new way of living and seeing the world (Matthew 4:19). He didn't die so we would stay the same. **When we commit to following Jesus, we're inviting Him to teach us how to change.**

Following Jesus can lead us to hard things. David, the writer of Psalm 23, reminds us that even though we walk through the valley of the shadow of death, we don't have to fear. **God is with us. He is guiding us and working through us. He will give us all we need.**

Part of what makes a move bold is that it takes faith. We take a step not knowing what will happen but knowing we can trust God to meet us there. **We make bold moves because we have the mover of mountains by our side.**

Request:

Mt. Pleasant is looking for three (3) Elder replacements to fulfill a 3-year term and three (3) At-Large Administrative Council members to fulfill a 3-year term.

These Elders and Admin Council leaders will begin their roles starting January 1, 2025. Nominees must be a member in good standing of Mt Pleasant Church for at least 3 years.

Elders as noted in article VIII serve as the spiritual leaders of the Church. An Elder nominee must be a mature believer who is able to teach and rightly handle the word of God. The Council of Elders shall serve on a rotating basis serving no more than 3 consecutive years.

Action:

If you would like to nominate a church member whom you believe would be a qualified candidate to serve in either the role of Elder or At-Large Admin Council starting January 1, 2025, please submit the names of those individuals via the <u>ONLINE BALLOT</u>, or you may contact the church Administrative Assistant, Felecia Motsinger, 336-475-6757. Nominees can also be submitted in person to the church office or via the nominations box in the FLC Lobby. All nominations for the role of Elder and Admin Council must be submitted by no later than Sunday, October 13.

Following this date, the current Elders and Deacons will review the list of candidates and confirm qualifications to proceed forward with communication specific to a church vote to be held on Sunday November 24.

When you hear the word "leader," you might think about an influential artist or celebrity, or a famous politician, or a coach on a soccer field, or that kid who just got elected class president. And, sure, those people are definitely leaders! But these aren't the only ways to lead. Great leaders don't have to have official positions, titles, or people who report to them. With God, being a great leader is something anyone can achieve because leadership is simply about becoming the kind of person who's worth following. But how? In this four-week series, we'll look at the example of Jesus, plus ordinary people like Moses, Solomon, and the apostle Paul, who were all given opportunities to lead and make a difference in others' lives. Please do not include Candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; scary or war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.
