"I CAN'T SERVE"

Does this sound familiar?

I would serve but I am just not qualified. I am so busy, I am too young, I don't know enough and I am afraid I will mess up. I just don't know if I have time or if God could even use me. Maybe these have been your excuses. What many have realized is that each reason they used to talk themselves out of serving was an area God wanted to use to bless them and those around them through serving.

• You can serve no matter your age.

God wants you to find community in His church. There will always be someone older who can lead you and someone younger you can lead. I Timothy 4 says we are to set an example in the way that we speak, love, and act. Knowing that other people are sacrificing their time and their energy as volunteers can encourage you toward serving others.

• You can serve no matter your circumstances.

God is giving you a story to use for His glory and your good. We all go through seasons of joy, seasons of pain, seasons of survival, and seasons of peace (Ecclesiastes 3:1-8). As God walks you through each of those seasons, He's building faith in you that will point others in similar circumstances to Him. God is not the only one that will walk with us through life. He's given us a family in our church that we can turn to for prayer, encouragement, and wisdom.

• You can serve no matter your ability.

Volunteering doesn't mean having all the answers. It means having a heart for God's people and wanting to love them. Making mistakes will happen; they happen to all of us. But it's when we are weak that God gets the most glory (2 Corinthians 12:9-12). Only He can use one broken person to bring about His healing in another broken person.

Many wrongly think you have to be perfect to serve. The truth is **God perfects you as you serve**. Serving has brought me some of life's biggest blessings. God has given me deep friendships with people who point me back to Him and encourage me. God has so many blessings waiting for us on the other side of obedience. He doesn't want us to change into a person we think is qualified to serve; **He wants to transform us as we serve**.

JUSTIFIED: A 4-Week Series from the New Testament on Anger.

SERIES OVERVIEW:

Anger is such a big, powerful emotion. When we're angry about things that matter, our anger can lead us toward action. Anger can even inspire us to make the world a better place! But other times, our anger can lead us to make choices that are harmful to ourselves or others. There's no escaping situations or people who make us angry, but how we respond when we're angry is up to us. So if we can't completely avoid getting angry, what can we do? In this four-week series, we'll explore four passages of Scripture from both the Old and New Testaments that might challenge our view on anger. We'll learn practical skills like when we feel angry, pause to ask God why. We'll see how, when we're angry, Jesus shows us how to respond. And in our anger, we'll be challenged to show grace and not get hurtful.
